THE government has been challenged on its decision not to renew funding for a multi-award multi-award winning Launceston exercise initiative while Tasmanians continue to wait for a preventative health strategy.

Usually jointly funded by the state government, the University of Tasmania and the Launceston City Council, Active Launceston has been forced to turn to crowdfunding since the government chose

provide money for 2016.
Bass Greens MHA Andrea Dawkins said it was a peculiar decision given the government's aim of becoming the healthiest state by 2025.

"We haven't seen any detail of a preventative strategy and I would've thought Active Launceston would've played an instru-mental role in preventative health," Ms Dawkins said. "Why are we removing a successful program?"

Health Minister Michael Ferguson said it was made explicit by the former government that Active Launceston's funding was one-off and would not be continued.

The previous government committed \$400,000 over two

the future," Mr Ferguson said.

"Future funding in preventative health, including promoting physical activity, will be considered in respect of the Healthy Tasmania process."

But opposition health spokeswoman Rebecca White accused Mr Ferguson of being interested only in "a reactionary model of
